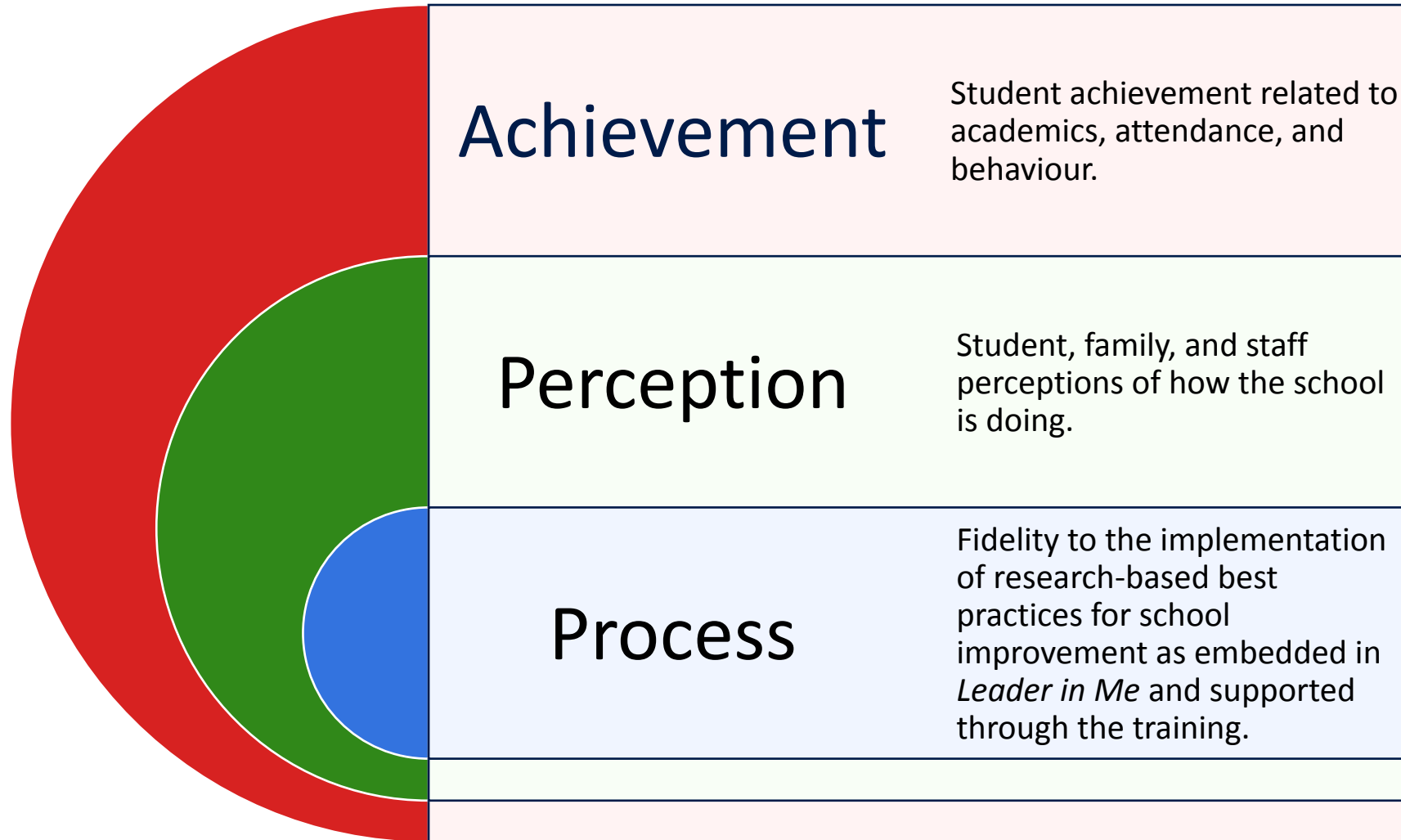

Academic Data

- Numeracy; specific to Computation and Estimation is below the Canadian Standard (5.1 at the school level comparative to 5.9)
- Increase the student proficiency level in STAR math across Grade 4-6
- Increase the number of students who achieve at the Standard of Excellence in all core subject areas

NEXT STEPS

- Track student proficiency across Grade 4-6 in STAR Numeracy and STAR Literacy
- Classroom focused scoreboards (along with School wide scoreboards) to encourage student goal setting, monitoring and reflection
- Further collaboration and partnerships with parents, families and community organizations through Place Based Learning, Community Impact Projects and opportunity for parental involvement in student growth
- Increased family events at the school (rooted in highly effective paradigms in Leadership, Culture and Academics- eg. Student led events, School/Community connections, school organized events focused on learning
- Continued focus on the impact of place based learning on overall quality of education and academic results
- Continue our Leader In Me journey and its impact on indicators of Culture, Leadership and Academics across students, parents and staff
- Embed "Excellent Learning Environments" into Grade level collaboration and collaborative inquiry questions to impact student learning and growth
- Regular use and refinement of Continuums of Support to improve instructional pedagogy for student growth and success
- Action Teams are in place to support School Improvement Goals
- School wide implementation of the pedagogy that supports, "Building Thinking Classrooms" is in place in all numeracy classes
